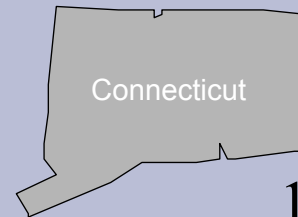
- Slide 1 shows the family lines that were in Connecticut in the early to mid 1600's.
 - The connecting lines show which lines married into which. With the result that there were two major lines left as the calendar turned and it became the 1700's. The lines were:
 - Bishop
 - Pennington

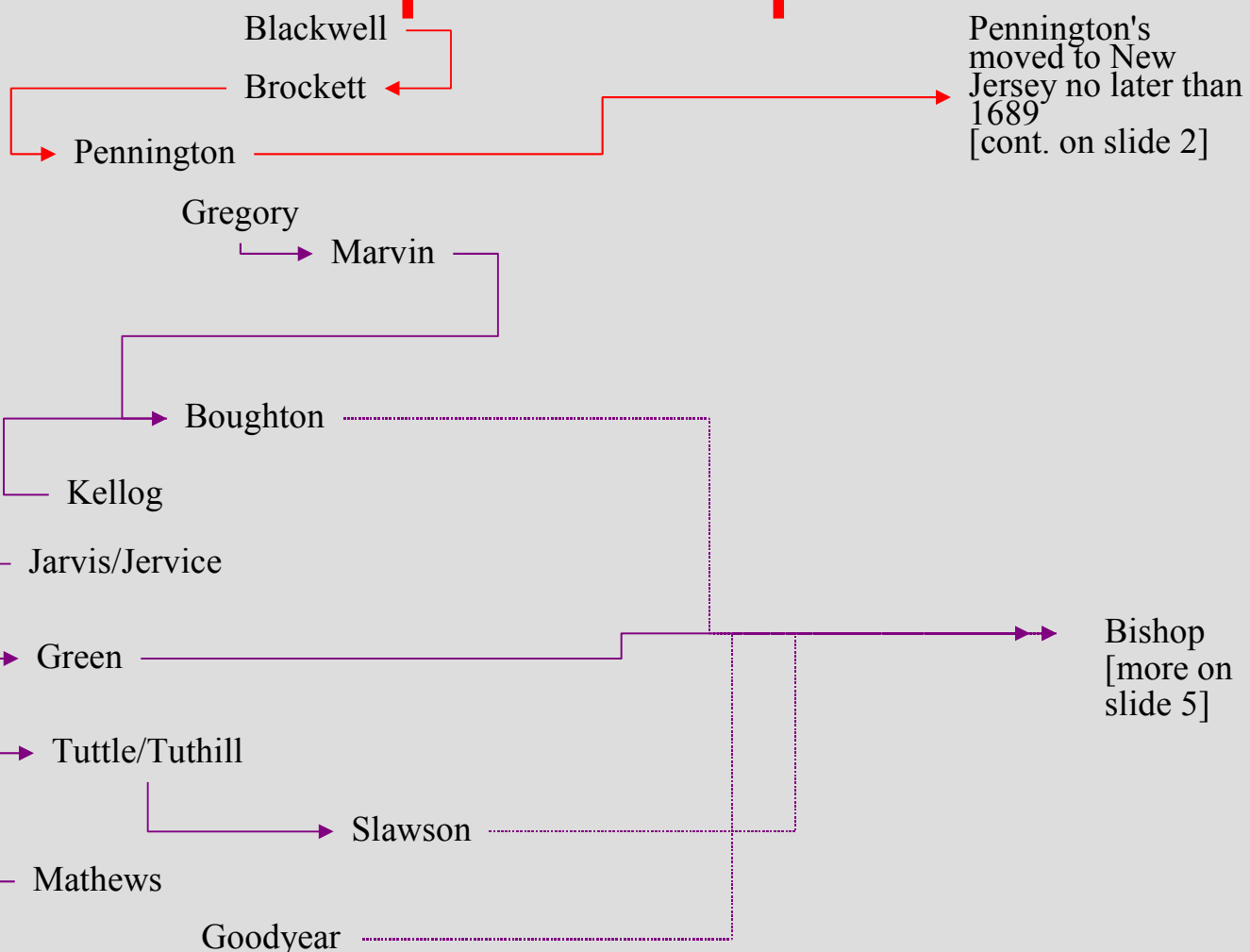

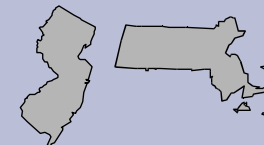

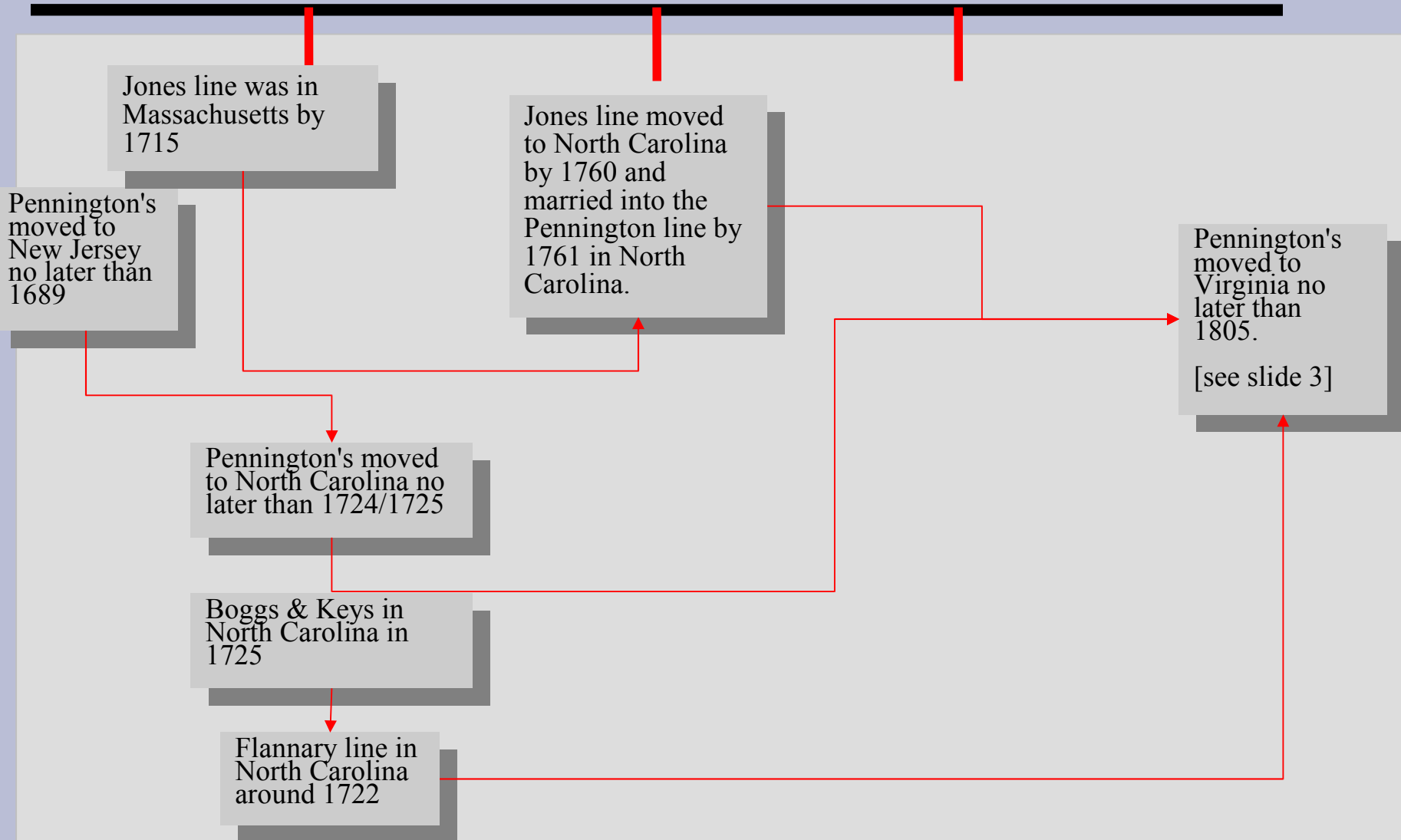

Pennington/Parsons line 1800 to 1900



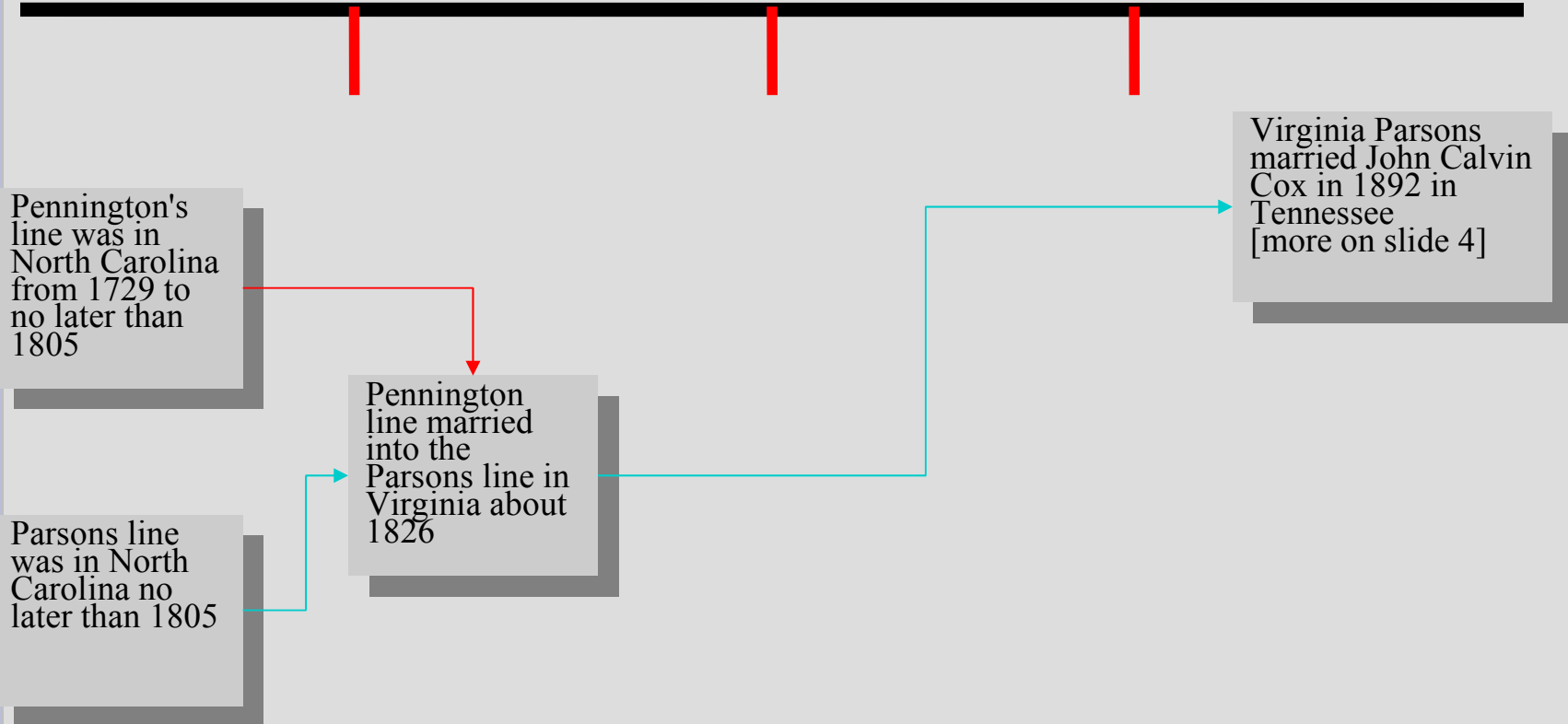

Parsons line was in North Carolina no later than 1805

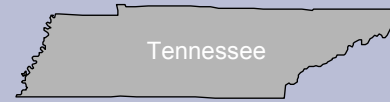
Pennington line married into the Parsons line in Virginia about 1826

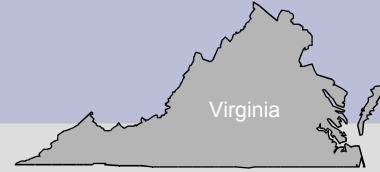
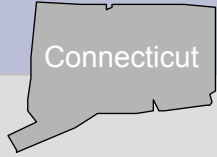

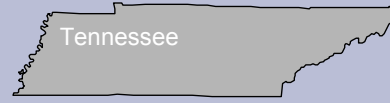
Bishop line was in Connecticut from pre-1700 to 1749 when they moved to New York.

Bishop's line 1800 to 1900

Part of the Bihsop line moved from Virginia to Tennessee sometime between 1820 and 1845.

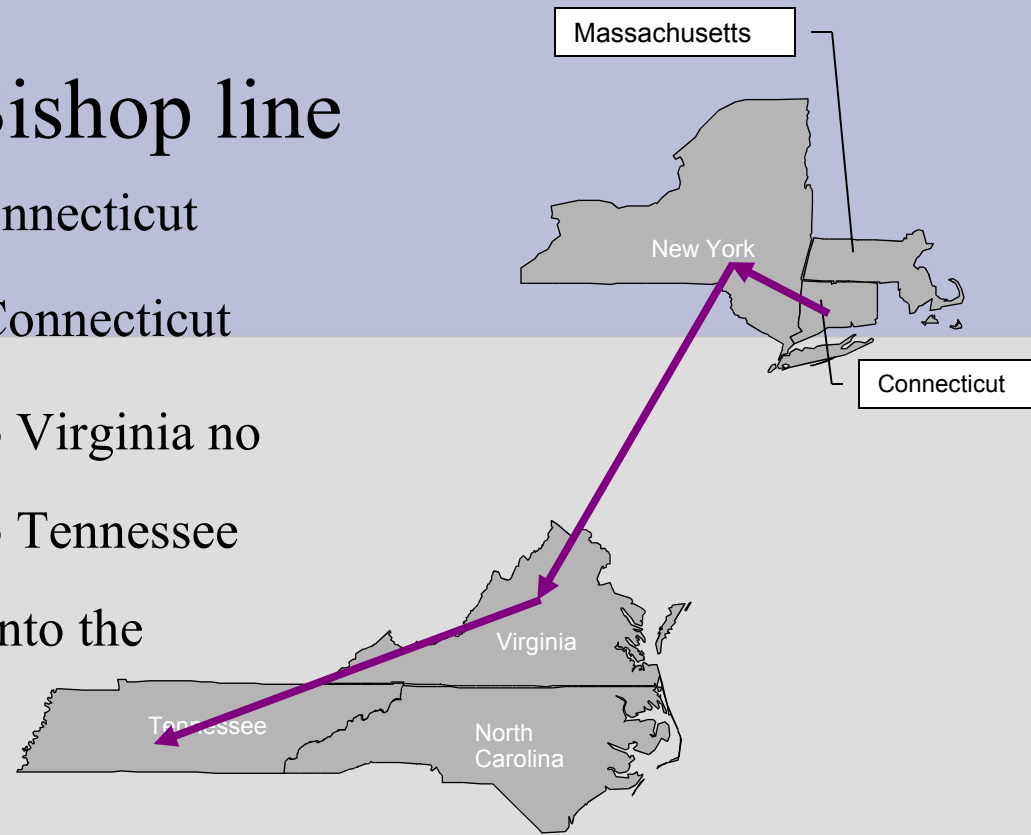
Lucinda Bishop married James Monroe Parsons in Virginia in 1851.

Virginia Parsons was born in 1874 and married John Calvin Cox in 1892 in Tennessee.

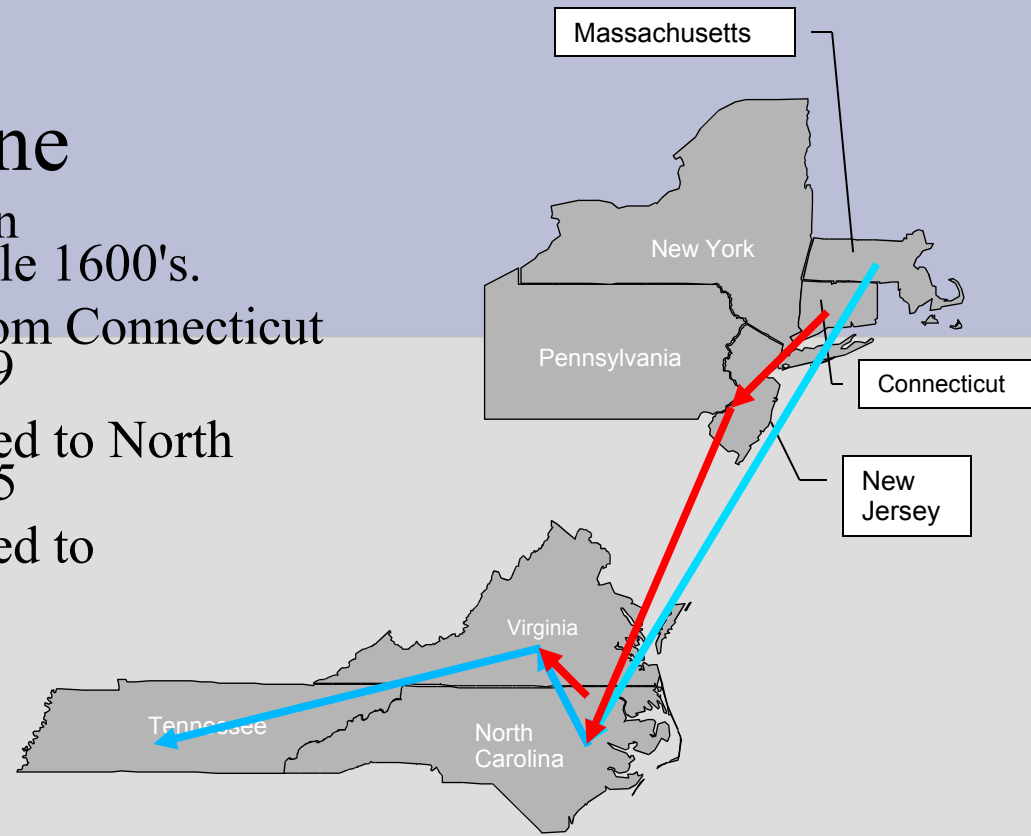
Following the Bishop line

- The Bishop line is found in Connecticut starting in the middle 1600's.
- The Bishop line moved from Connecticut to New York by 1763
- The Bishop line then moved to Virginia no later than 1794
- The Bishop line then moved to Tennessee between 1851 and 1870
- The Bishop line then married into the Parsons line



Following the Pennington Line

- The Pennington line is found in Connecticut starting in the middle 1600's.
- The Pennington line moved from Connecticut to New Jersey no later than 1689
- The Pennington line then moved to North Carolina no later than 1724/1725
- The Pennington line then moved to Virginia in 1805



- The Jones line was in Massachusetts by 1715 then moved to North Carolina by 1761 and married into the Pennington line there.
- The Parsons line was in North Carolina by 1802 then moved to Virginia by 1826 and the Pennington line married into the Parsons line there.
- The Parsons line then moved to Tennessee by 1892.
